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MHA ICD-10 Steering Committee

- Established in February 2011
- Purpose
 - Provide education and resources to help MD Hospitals begin planning for the ICD-10 transition
 - Understand the transition plans of major payors
 - Identify the transition planning and implementation needs related to HSCRC methodologies and other state regulatory issues

MHA ICD-10 Steering Committee

- **Activities**
 - Identified vendors and payors that would need to be engaged in the discussion
 - Collaborated with the HSCRC to determine their role and involvement
 - Hosted roundtable discussions with Payor Representatives, Vendor Representatives and other Provider Representatives to determine collaborative opportunities

MHA ICD-10 Steering Committee

- **Activities**
 - Set up an ICD-10 Resources Web Page
 - Established three smaller workgroups
 - Testing
 - Billing and Policy Changes
 - HSCRC Activities
 - Issued a readiness survey in September to be completed by providers, payors and vendors

Testing Work Group

- Met four times by conference call between August and September 2011
- Discussion ranged from how to handle accuracy of coding to end-to-end testing
- Participants included payors, vendors and providers
- Feedback: ICD-10 readiness varies across the board. Some will be ready to test next spring, others not until January 2013...

Testing Work Group

- Suggested Testing Phases and Timelines were Established
 - Testing the Accuracy of Coding
 - End to End Testing: Provider to Clearing House to Health Plan
 - Testing for health plan processing accuracy and revenue neutrality

HSCRC Activities

- 1) Developed and hosted an information exchange session in April 2011
 - Ingenix (contractor for the HSCRC) described areas encompassed by ICD-10
 - Providers, payers, vendors exchanged ideas relating to ICD-10 implementation
- 2) Initiated transition discussion with HSCRC data vendor, St. Paul
 - Effort to minimize change to Acute hospitals' record layout
 - Potential changes to Chronic and Behavioral Health Data submission requirements
- 3) Coordinated discussions with 3M representatives
 - Discussed the readiness of APR-DRG, EAPG and PPC products transition to ICD-10

Next Steps

- 1) HSCRC and MHA will jointly host a meeting of the full Collaborative later this fall
- 2) Tentative discussion topics include:
 - ICD-10 readiness survey results
 - Testing Strategies
 - St. Paul transition plans
 - Timetable of when data can be submitted using ICD-10
 - 3M products discussion
 - Availability of grouper
 - ICD -10 replication of ICD-9 grouper for APR DRG, EAPGs, PPRs
